OVERVIEW

Claritas Pop-Facts Advanced provides demographic data based on the U.S. Census, American Community Survey (ACS), and other sources. There are several demographic characteristics included to help you know more about consumers. Pop-Facts® Advanced provides current year estimates and five-year projections. For this release, current year and five-year refers to 2026 estimates and 2031 projections, respectively. The target date for estimates and projections is January 1 of the relevant year. The data set also includes 2010 and 2020 decennial census data for current year geographies.

WHAT'S NEW

Methodological Changes

With over four decades of trusted industry experience, Claritas is always looking for ways to innovate and improve on estimation techniques to adapt to a changing demographic landscape and to take advantage of new resources. With this release, the following enhancements were implemented:

New American Community Survey (ACS) Data

The 2026 update continues the full use of ACS 5-Year data at the block group level and annual releases of one-year and five-year ACS data for all areas. This update makes use of 2023 ACS data.

2024 Census Bureau County Population Estimates

This year's update also uses 2024 Census Bureau County Population estimates as of July 1, 2024.

Enhanced Block Group Base Counts

Our block group base counts methodology has been enhanced to utilize new data from the Census Bureau that tracks changes in housing unit counts since the last decennial census.

Special Considerations for Natural Disasters

Heading into this update, Claritas was mindful of recent natural disasters, particularly the fires in Los Angeles, California. After careful research, we found that the monthly delivery statistics we receive from the United States Postal Service (USPS) was reflective of recent changes in the count of housing units. We used data from CalFire to pinpoint the exact geographic location of the housing unit loss. We also supplemented this with recent data from our Master Address File to inform the estimates in our Pop-Facts Block product, which is important when assigning data to non-Census based geographies such as ZIP Codes.

KNOWN DISCREPANCY IN AGE AND SEX DATA

For standard five-year age breaks (0 to 4, 5 to 9, and so on), the estimates of population by age/sex are consistent with the estimates of population by age/sex summed across race/ethnicity categories. However, users might find differences for single years of age or age ranges other than the standard five-year categories. For example, the estimate of males ages 60 to 62 might be different from the estimate of males ages 60 to 62 summed across all race/ethnicity categories.

The differences trace to the fact that the estimates of population by age/sex and population by age/sex/race/ethnicity are produced for the standard five-year categories, and then split to single years of age, which are then summed to create more detailed breaks. The split of age/sex to single year categories is enhanced by applying separate split factors for persons in households and those living in group quarters of various types. For example, the percent of persons ages 20 to 24 who are ages 20 can be different in areas with large college dormitory populations compared to those with persons living in households. The enhancement is applied to the estimates of total population by age/sex, where the method separates by household versus group quarters population. However, the enhancement is not feasible for the estimates of population by age/sex/race/ethnicity, which are not produced separately for persons in households and group quarters, so single year data from this tabulation can differ.
